



TOILET PAPER ROCKET SHIP

The artist, Darrell Wakelam, is famous for the sculptures he makes out of everyday objects like toilet rolls and paper plates.



On the next page is his guide to making a toilet roll rocket ship. Why don't you have a go?

If you don't have toilet or kitchen rolls, you could use cardboard packaging or cereal boxes and bend it to make the curves you need. You can decorate it with paint, felt-tips, colour pencils, paper, tin foil – anything you have at home!

1 - Cut pieces and tape down different sized tubes.



3 - Make the 'nose' and other sections.



6 - Cut out colours from old magazines



4 - Add details by sticking on straws, pasta or matchsticks.

... and glue them on to hide the tape and to make the rocket's fiery trail and some planets.



2 - Make the wings using leftover bits. Glue on or slot into each other.



5 - Make some booster rockets at the back.



7 - Roll up some tin foil to make stars.

You can either paint your rocket, or glue on some more tin foil.
